Death Valley, California, is a place of extremes. It is one of the hottest (hot) places on earth. The second highest (high) recorded temperature in the world (57°C) was recorded in Death Valley in July, 1913. Daytime temperatures are higher than (high) 40°C for at least four months of the year. In most desert regions, night time temperatures are a lot cooler than (cool) day time temperatures. Although this is also true in Death Valley, in summer it makes very little difference. With night time temperatures hardly ever dropping lower than (low) 30°C that often means that the nights can feel almost as hot (hot) as the day. Fewer than (few) 5 cm of rain fall per year on average, and some years there's no rain at all. It is also a place of extreme differences. Badwater, a dry salt lake at the floor of the valley, is the lowest (low) point of land in the USA. Thanks to these extremes, Death Valley has become the home of what is by far the world's toughest (tough) foot race, the Death Valley Ultramarathon. The most extreme (extreme) of all physical challenges, the race covers 135 miles in 45°C, from Badwater, Death Valley, at 82 m below sea level to Whitney Portal at 2,500 m. There is a time limit of just 60 hours to finish the race. The fastest (fast) runner did it in just over 22 hours.

In 2002, the Man Group became the sponsor and they chose the new name, keeping 'Booker'. However, when the panel of judges has been finalized, they are left to make their own decisions without any further involvement or interference from the prize sponsor. The Man Booker judges include critics, writers and academics to maintain the consistent quality of the prize and its influence is such that the winner will almost certainly see the sales increase considerably, in addition to the £50,000 that comes with the prize.
